<p>The Group Home Worker is responsible for providing assistance in the daily living tasks, personal care and support, and ensuring the personal safety and welfare of individuals in the Chippewa County Family Project Home while serving as an effective role model.</p> <p>QUALIFICATIONS</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. A foster home applicant or licensee shall meet all of the following qualifications: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Be 18 years of age or older. b. Must have at least a High School Diploma or GED (preferred Associates in Childhood Education, Social Science, Human Services, or a related Field). c. Be of good moral character. d. Express a willingness to provide care for children who are served by Chippewa County Family Project. <ol style="list-style-type: none"> i. Have an interest in providing care for children who are 14-18. e. Demonstrate an understanding of the care which must be provided to the children served by Chippewa County Family Project. f. Have previous experience dealing with teenagers preferably those with a history of mental health, substance abuse disorders, or those with social, economic and/or social deterrents of health. g. Express a willingness to learn how to provide for children served by Chippewa County Family Project. h. Express willingness to attend conferences, seek out other helpful resources to increase understanding of forming connections, and providing essential care to the teens. i. Must be willing to complete the Group Home Training protocol, CPR, and First Aid training. j. Willing to seek training experiences for trauma informed care. k. Willing to incorporate a person centered trauma informed care method of treatment and building healthy connections with the teenagers. l. Have adequate time to provide care and supervision for the children. m. Have a defined legal source of income, be capable of managing that income, and to meet the needs of the foster family. n. Be of such physical, mental, and emotional health to assure appropriate care of children. o. Express willingness, ability, and work ethic to the foster child's family or future family. 			

- p. Be of good moral character and suitable to meet the needs of children by providing adequate care, supervision, and guidance.
- q. Demonstrate a willingness and ability to comply with all facility and licensing rules and the employee policies and procedures for the foster homes.
- r. Must submit to a pre-employment, annual, and random drug screening protocol.
- s. Must possess a valid Driver's License and have access to reliable transportation.
- t. Must consent and pass all criminal history background checks with includes finger printing and Department of Health and Human Services review.
